

- Teams of Elders






3rd Century - Persecution, Heresy, Origen & Tertullian

4th Century - Christian empire emerges

- Severe persecution to moral decay
- 8 significant events
 - 1. Conversion of Constantine (312)
 - 2. Council of Nicaea (Turkey, 325)
 - 3. Constantine moves empire's capital (330)
 - 4. Council of Constantinople (Turkey, 381)
 - 5. Damasus becomes Bishop of Rome (366-384)
 - 6. Jerome begins Vulgate (382)
 - 7. Conversion of Augustine of Hippo (North Africa, 387)
 - 8. Councils of Hippo (393) & Carthage (North Africa, 397)
- Antioch became major center of Christianity (half of 500,000)



5th Century - City of God & City of Man

- Barbarians & fall of Rome (410, 455)
- Pope Leo I (440-461)
- Council of Chalcedon (Turkey, 451)
- Pelagian Controversy



6th Century - Justinian & Benedict

- Justinian I, builder & defender
- Benedict, patriarch of Monasticism



7th Century - Gregory the Great & the Rise of Islam


- Gregory the Great expanded Rome

8th Century -Iconoclastic Controversy

- West & East fought
 over icons
- The 2nd Council of Nicaea (787)





9th Century - Struggle for power in the Church

- West & East fought over Nicaean Creed
- Nicholas forged documents



10th Century - the Dark Ages

- Rise of Eastern church power & influence
- Popes in Rome left alone
- Christianity spreads to Slavs

11th Century - the Great Schism

- West & East split into 2 churches (1054)
- West's clause added to
 Nicean Creed
- Struggle really over authority in church
